1 APRIL | SATURDAY

Pray for good health for the Hofmanns, Melias and for Thadee, Haja and their three children. Small wounds get infected easily in the humid climate of Ikongo. They have access to medical care, but for more serious illnesses they have a long and difficult journey to better facilities.

2 APRIL | SUNDAY

Pray for the new Tanala believers in Ikongo who are eager to go out and tell other villages the good news. They still have a lot of new things to learn and are also facing the difficulty of opposing some members of their community who are not willing to let go of their animistic traditions. also links to complementary stories and articles which we trust will encourage you to pray with more insight and praise God for what he is doing amongst African people.

3 APRIL | MONDAY

More than 82 Tanala people joined the newly organised Sunday services, and more than 24 of them meet to do Bible studies. Praise God for such an amazing development over just a few months, and pray that God's word would take root in their lives.

4 APRIL | TUESDAY

Having Melias, Thadee and Haja working among their own people is enormously effective. They are well received and gain the trust of the people. Praise God for this, but also ask that the Lord would provide for them financially, as they don't yet have sufficient support.

5 APRIL | WEDNESDAY

The Hofmanns moved to the Sandrohy area in February and are establishing relationships and learning the Tanala dialect (they already speak some official Malagasy). Pray that they will pick up the dialect quickly and that the Tanala will be patient with them as they learn.

6 APRIL | THURSDAY

Praise the Lord for the wise elders in the villages around Sandrohy. They say that if the news of Jesus is good, then the people have to hear it! It is so good to see that God already started his work among the Tanala before any missionaries even entered the area.

7 APRIL | FRIDAY

The Hofmanns' five children continue to be

homeschooled by their mum, Katja. Please ask the Lord to help her and the children in their new routines. It is hard for them to concentrate as many of the local children don't go to school and hang around the village making noise all day.

Although many villages have access to water and toilets (drop pits), general hygiene is not very good. This causes many easily avoidable diseases and infected wounds. Pray that along with the good news of Jesus, the Tanala would also accept healthy lifestyles.
