Who are the Datooga?

he Datooga are an unreached people group of Central Tanzania. Although scattered throughout this region, their homeland seems to be centred near Mount Hanang, which they consider sacred and which plays an important role in their songs and myths. The Datooga are a large group of former nomads, who have now settled as farmers. Many keep animals, mainly cattle, but also goats, sheep, donkeys and chicken. They are proud of their culture and see no reason to change. Few children go to school and most Datooga neither read nor write.

What do they believe?

The Datooga are animists, respecting and fearing their ancestors. They communicate with them through spirits, so witchcraft and sorcery are cultural norms. They believe in a distant creator named 'Aseeta' who has twin sons who they expect to come to rule and judge the world some day. They have many rituals, including worshipping at a special tree and going to the mountains to call on their ancestors.

What is being done to reach them?

In 2006 a TIMO team served among the Datooga and saw some Datooga believe, and even some go to Bible school. Pray these would be strong in the Lord and anointed evangelists. Simon & Sue French are working among them, discipling Datooga believers through Bible teaching and seminars. They are also working on translating Bible stories and sharing them with those who have yet to hear the gospel.



Many Datooga live in avid and hard to access places which often makes them difficult to get to.

A goat project has been set-up to help African evangelists supplement their income.



Chronological Bible storytelling has become a useful ministry as Storytelling plays a big part in Datooga life.
