

Job: Area Mobiliser for Northern England and North Wales (3 Year Fixed Term)

Africa Inland Mission is looking to appoint an Area Mobiliser to join its European Mobilising Team. This is a vital role with representational, pastoral and spiritual dimensions. The successful candidate will be responsible for making the work of AIM International known in Northern England and North Wales, supporting and advising enquirers and applicants and assisting with the pastoral care of serving missionaries.

The role includes:

- making the work of AIM known by:
 - mobilising long and short-term personnel
 - speaking in churches
 - networking with church leaders
 - personal support raising
 - organising and attending mission events
- helping enquirers, applicants and their churches as they explore potential ministry with AIM
- maintaining records on work, contacts and relevant personnel-related information on the Contact and Relation Management database (ThankQ)
- providing pastoral care (including debriefing) to serving mission partners in conjunction with their churches and the Personnel Department at the European HQ in Nottingham

Within the terms of the Employment Equality (Religion or Belief) Regulations 2003, it is a Genuine Occupational Requirement that the successful candidate agrees with and signs AIM International's Statement of Faith. In addition AIM UK has a Faith and Finance policy applying to all members of staff. The policy requires staff to actively participate in developing financial and prayerful support. - excellent people skills, including networking, motivating, and the ability to relate positively to Churches, Bible Colleges, Christian Unions, and their leaders

- competence in the use of Microsoft Word, Outlook and Database management
- overseas experience (preferred)
- formal training/qualification in theology/missiology (preferred)
- experience of mission mobilisation (preferred)
