# **1 APRIL** | SUNDAY

Pray against the growing materialism and spiritual apathy among the Shibushi. Many want to prove their worth and status through owning 4x4s, iPhones, building bigger houses, and putting on more extravagant weddings. Pray they would realise their efforts are futile and that instead they would find satisfaction in Jesus.

# 2 APRIL | MONDAY

Many Shibushi men love sport, and fitness classes are becoming more popular for women. Pray for Chris as he plays in a men's football team, and for Sarah and Lucy (a short termer) as they go to fitness classes. Pray that they would be bold in their witness.

### 3 APRIL | TUESDAY

Many students leave Mayotte to go to university or to look for work in France. Pray that French churches would connect with Shibushi students. Pray for Alan and Colo, Shibushi men who heard the truth in France, that it would take root in their hearts and not be snatched away.

# 4 APRIL | WEDNESDAY

Baba S and Mama Bey have heard Bible stories from creation to Christ. Pray that these stories would dwell in their hearts. Pray that as they think about what they have heard, they would be convicted about the person of Jesus and that they would be led to true repentance and obedience.

## **5 APRIL | THURSDAY**

Pray that the one Christian family in the village would be encouraged in their faith and boldly share it with others. Pray that the small group of believers and seekers would continue to meet regularly to feed on God's Word together and pray for one another.

# 6 APRIL | FRIDAY

At the weekends and during the holidays, the Shibushi busy themselves with endless cooking events, weddings, meetings and prayer vigils. Pray that as our missionaries spend a lot of time participating in these events and learning language that there would be opportunities to share the gospel.

# 7 APRIL | SATURDAY

Pray for Zara, an English teacher who got

married recently. Praise God for opportunities to share the gospel with her and for Lucy's close friendship with her. Ask that she would be open to hearing more about Jesus.

# WEEKLY FOCUS: CAR

IM first began ministry in the Central African Republic (CAR) in the 1930s. Since then the church has grown, but



efforts to share the gospel with Muslim people groups has been disrupted by ongoing unrest. The country is characterised by violence, and many people are internally displaced or living in refugee camps.

## **8 APRIL | SUNDAY**

CAR has been chaotic for years, with no central authority able to establish order. Pray for the President, Faustin-Archange Touadera who, when running for office, declared himself to be a peacemaker who would bridge the religious divides. Pray too for good government and a return to law and order throughout the country.

# 9 APRIL | MONDAY

Terrible violence has racked CAR in recent years, led by a Muslim rebel group called Seleka which has been demanding independence for the predominantly Muslim north. Pray that there would be an end to the atrocities that they are committing, and especially for their repentance.

## 10 APRIL | TUESDAY

A 'Christian' militia, called Anti-Balaka, has also committed atrocities against Muslims, creating a spiral of violence. Pray that all who claim the name of Christ would follow his example and teaching. Pray that they would be able to find peaceful ways of resolving conflict, even in the face of loss.

#### 11 APRIL | WEDNESDAY

Pray for the church in CAR, that the Lord of Hosts would encourage them, provide for them, protect them, and use them to bring the gospel to their neighbours. Pray that they would hold firm and resist hatred and division. Pray that wise and godly leaders would disciple their congregations.

#### 12 APRIL | THURSDAY

Pray specifically for our partner church, the CEEC (Communauté des Eglises Evangéliques en Centrafrique), in Zemio. Most members are now refugees in DR Congo. Pray the Lord would care for them and soon restore them to Zemio. Pray for the President of CEEC, Rev. Emmanuel Koffo, as he leads the church.

## 13 APRIL | FRIDAY


As groups of believers gather for worship in refugee camps and in rural areas, pray that the Lord would teach them what is essential about church, faith, and community. Pray too that the Lord would send witnesses to the Mbororo people (Muslim nomads), that he would be bringing them to himself.

# 14 APRIL | SATURDAY

Pray for the safety and healing of the Zande people, many of whom have been displaced into DR Congo, and have lost friends, relatives and neighbours. Pray that they would be able to forgive those who have committed atrocities and begin to rebuild their lives.

It is such a comfort that whatever our situation we can turn to God and know that he loves us. Give thanks for that truth and pray that our missionaries would grow in their understanding of these certainties: God is sovereign. Suffering is normal. Jesus is worth it.

## 19 APRIL | THURSDAY

Carrie is currently on home assignment in the UK until July. Pray for Hiram as he continues in the International Crisis role. Pray too for Carrie's time at home, that she will be encouraged and refreshed and that she will know great joy in spending time with friends and family.

#### 20 APRIL | FRIDAY

Questions about risk and mission raise complex legal and theological issues. Pray we would submit ourselves to God and seek to follow him in faith. Pray for open communication between all parties, that we understand each other's reasoning and keep Christ at the centre.

#### 21 APRIL | SATURDAY

Pray that God would keep our missionaries safe and secure as they travel by road and by air. Pray that they would make wise decisions on when and how to travel. Give thanks for AIM AIR and other missionary mechanics who do so much to keep our missionaries secure.
