Join us in giving thanks for the completion of the New Testament in the Rendille language.

In Korr, one of Kenya's northern frontier towns, the air seems to be constantly stirring. Traditionally, the Rendille are nomads. Traditionally, they do what they must to survive in a hostile environment. Traditionally, they have no access to Scripture in their language. Things have changed.

The day was a crescendo. What started quietly as a small gathering of local believers and missionaries became a major cultural celebration. The climax featured the most prized possession in traditional Rendille culture – camels. And on their backs were boxes of freshly-printed Rendille New Testaments. Escorting them in was a procession of dancers and singers.

The Bible dedication event marked the culmination of a 37-year translation journey begun by now-retired AIM missionaries Nick and Lynn Swanepoel, who set out to put the Rendille language in written form. The New Testaments represent the combined effort of Africa Inland Mission, Bible Translation & Literacy (BTL), Seed Company, and other partners from around the world.

Rendille Pastor, David Gargule, of the Africa Inland Church, Korr, had the privilege of delivering the first sermon from the Rendille New Testament. He summed up the translation accomplishment saying, "My morning devotional holds deeper meaning now that I can read the words of God in my own language."

13 JAN • MONDAY

Pray for the Lord to strengthen and encourage Rendille Christians who are seeking to share the gospel more widely. Pray that the Scriptures will be loved, cherished, read, taught and obeyed in Rendille households, and for the Word of God to spread rapidly.

14 JAN • TUESDAY

Tirrim Secondary School, a Christian school among the Rendille, moved location in April. The new site has a better water supply, is closer to the Rendille villages, but further from the local town so students won't be distracted. Pray that the students would benefit from the move.



15 JAN • WEDNESDAY

Please pray for the Muslim students studying at Tirrim school. Pray that the Word of God that is shared would be planted in their minds and that through this God would draw them to himself. Please pray for breakthroughs to encourage staff and students.

16 JAN • THURSDAY

As well as providing the New Testament in the Rendille language, the team were also able to share 500 audio New Testaments for those who can't read. Pray that access to God's Word in their heart language would lead to real transformation among the Rendille.

17 JAN • FRIDAY

Pray that the Rendille people will see the lives of their Christian friends and family and be convinced the gospel is true. Pray that they won't succumb to the influence of Islam, but will instead share the gospel with the Muslim teachers who have been sent to convert them.

Jessica Goldschmidt works with youth in Rwanda, coordinating 3d Christian Camps, where young people can explore Christianity and be trained for future ministry. She shares Arnold's story.

Baptised as a Catholic when he was small. Arnold's church attendance actually meant playing outside it. He started taking drugs in secondary school and as he managed to pass his secondary school exams without praying, he figured he didn't need God. His cousin, who is on the camp committee, mentioned our camps to him. He didn't fit the 'target' group for our ministry training camp: he wasn't saved! But he came. He came without a Bible and didn't know what to do during the personal devotion time as he couldn't read the Bible passage. At some point, he told his cousin who lent him his Bible. He could then read but he couldn't understand. One of the counsellors encouraged him to pray and ask for the Holy Spirit to help him understand what he was reading. It worked! During the camp he was introduced to the gospel. After spending time with the camp teachers, he received Christ as his Saviour. Arnold says that was the point when everything changed. He was filled with so much joy. His Christian friends were so happy when he told them. He had tried to change his life on



his own before, but he hadn't managed. Now, the drug addiction he had struggled with had completely gone. His friends who were taking drugs with him saw that his life changed. They want the same thing too! He is going to church and has made friends who can help him. His prayer is to see his parents and siblings come to know Christ.

20 JAN • MONDAY

Please pray specifically for the campers who have attended our camps and made a personal decision to follow Christ; pray that they would continue in their commitment and live in obedience to him.

21 JAN • TUESDAY

Please pray for Arnold, that as he lives out his new faith, his parents, siblings and friends would also turn to Christ because of his example. Pray that they would have the right people come alongside them to offer discipleship and encouragement.

22 JAN • WEDNESDAY

Please pray for the Bible study groups that have started in different churches following training camps, that the youth would be transformed as they study God's word together.
