JOB DESCRIPTION

We are looking for enthusiastic supporters of AIM to be proactive in their own circles to share and promote the work of AIM, in order to multiply our mobilisation efforts here in the UK.

We want to inspire and empower our volunteers to be regularly taking proactive steps to help mobilise people, prayer and finances for the work of AIM. You will be widening our network of connections, and enabling churches and individuals to engage with the needs of Africa's unreached peoples through the resources we produce. This will help us to build and maintain strong relationships with local churches, who we believe are God's means of sending new workers.

We are praying that God would raise up

- more workers to go out into the harvest fields of unreached African people groups, and
- more prayer and financial supporters, to enable the work to continue and to thrive.

You could be a part of the answer to those prayers by becoming a volunteer and sharing your love for AIM and it's work among Africa's unreached peoples.

AIM will provide regular ideas, tips and resources that can be used to inspire others including Bible studies, Sunday service ideas, our latest videos, opportunities to serve and other resources. Volunteers will simply put these ideas and resources into practice, or pass them on and recommend them to people they know who might be interested and could put them to good use. In particular volunteers can be sharing with their own church family, leadership and other churches in their networks or family of churches. Typically we would expect you to spend at least 2-3 hours per month performing these activities.

With the advent of COVID-19 our mobilisation activities have changed and in many ways have been restricted. It's hard to get out and meet people in

person. You can help by being our hands and feet, telling people in your area and networks about AIM, encouraging people to consider their involvement through going, sending or supporting, and recommending resources that could be of use and benefit to them and their church families.

ROLE RESPONSIBILITIES:

1. Read the regular volunteer communication and review the new resources that are highlighted
2. Be willing to personally put new ideas and resources into practice where appropriate
3. Be proactive in sharing ideas and resources with your church and churches known to you. This could include facilitating the use of resources if appropriate.
4. Keep up to date with general AIM news via Connect and our website/social media
5. Attend suggested training or social events for volunteers whenever possible
6. Keep the Volunteers Co-ordinator informed of how you have been using and sharing resources
7. Contact the Volunteers Co-ordinator in the case of
 - a. queries relating to the volunteer role
 - b. direct enquiries from people or churches wanting to discuss partnering or serving with AIM
 - c. requesting advice or clarification on legal matters e.g. DBS requirements
